


Message from Mr. Meigs


The Oregon School Report Card provides additional information. Lowrie Primary School's Overall State Rating of 4

Lowrie has become a strong community. We look forward to collaborating with you to grow the greatest thinkers and most thoughtful people for the world.





CALIFICACIÓN GENERAL DEL ESTADO ¿CÓMO SE DESEMPEÑAN LOS ESTUDIANTES EN ESTA ESCUELA EN COMPARACIÓN CON LOS ESTUDIANTES EN OTRAS ESCUELAS?

La calificación general del estado pretende resumir los éxitos y desafíos de esta escuela. Se basa en una combinación de hasta cinco factores. Tres de estos factores vienen de resultados de exámenes estandarizados de lectura y matemáticas: el rendimiento estudiantil, el crecimiento de los estudiantes, y el crecimiento de los subgrupos marginados. Tenga en cuenta que esta clasificación se basa principalmente en exámenes de alto riesgo y, por tanto, representa una visión limitada de rendimiento de los estudiantes. Otros aspectos de este reporte de calificaciones están diseñados para poner esta calificación en el contexto adecuado.

En comparación a todas las escuelas a nivel estatal en 2013-14, esta escuela está calificada como Nivel 4.
