Our District

The West Linn-Wilsonville School District covers 42 square miles in the south metropolitan area of Portland, Oregon. The district includes two towns, West Linn and Wilsonville, and a rural area of Clackamas County. The district is a K-12 public school system with approximately 8,400 students.

The West Linn-Wilsonville School District prides itself on substantial staff development opportunities for its teaching staff. It is the district's belief that a well educated staff serves its students well.

Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) scores are among the highest in Oregon, and Oregon consistently ranks first or second in SAT scores nationwide for states in which fifty percent or more of the graduating seniors take the test. Approximately 90% of all West Linn-Wilsonville graduates go on to two- and four-year colleges.

Honors Graduation Requirements

- Balance of Honors Courses in both the Humanities and Math/Science
- Must have the following:
 - 6 AP/Honor class credits
 - 3.6 or higher weighted GPA
 - must have at least 2 credits in Humanities AP/Honors courses
 - 2 credits in Math/Science AP/Honors courses
- All honors courses must be taken for a grade
- Twenty hours of community service
- Participate in at least 1 co-curricular activity during Junior or Senior year

Weighted Grades / Class Rank

- Only courses with AP designation carry one extra grade point (A=5, B=4, C=3, D=2, F=0)
- Class rank is reported by both unweighted and weighted grade point averages
- GPA is reported both by weighted and un-weighted grade point average on the final transcript

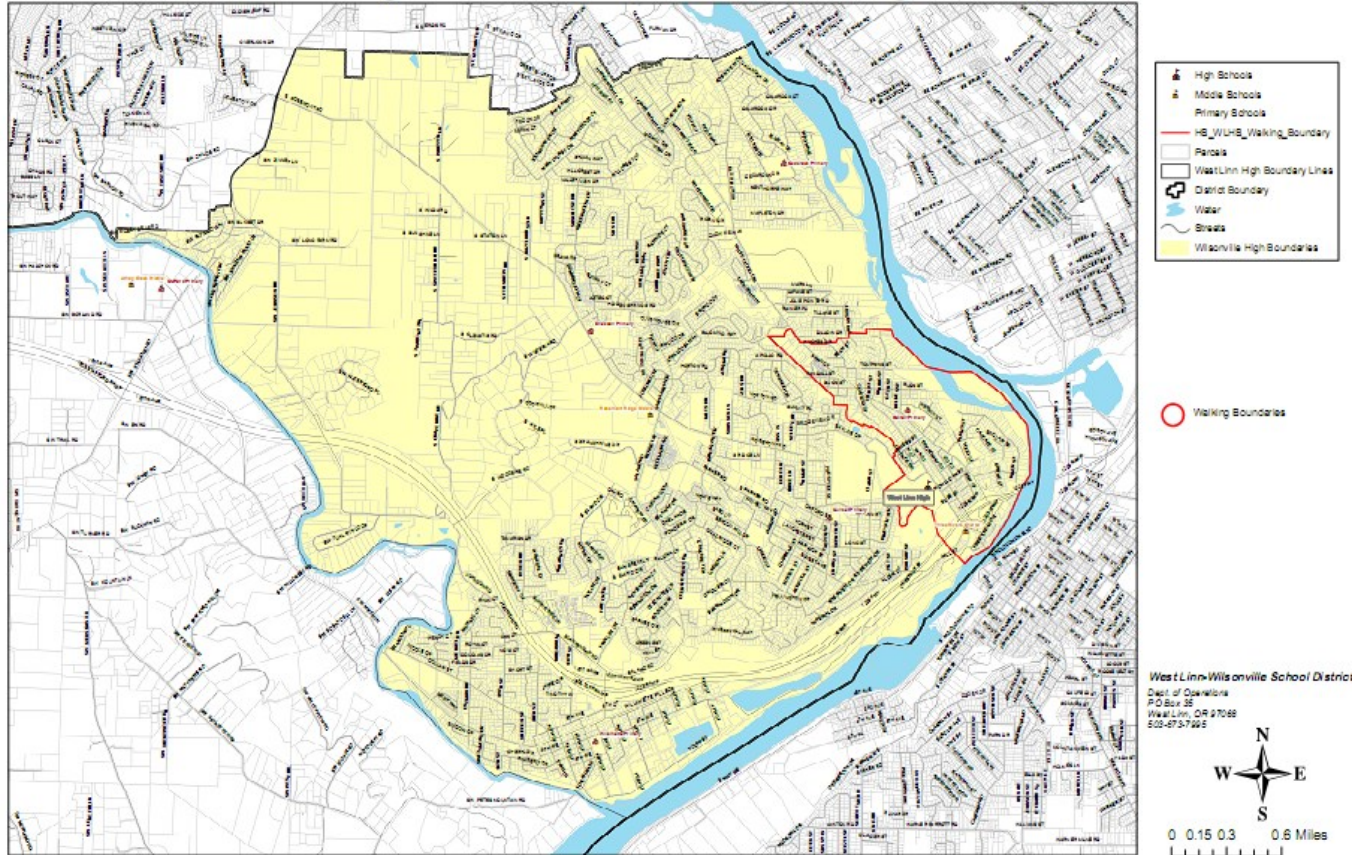
