Oregon University System "D" Rule

- No Oregon public university will accept grades lower than a "C-" in required academic courses.
- Students with "Ds" or lower in these courses will be required to make up the credit before applying to an Oregon public university.
- This does not apply to private or community college.

Athletic Participation PE Credit

- PBC Athletic PE credit does NOT substitute for Wellness I or II.
- The maximum credits earned through this process are 2 PE credits:
 - .5 credit per year
- This process includes: all OSAA athletics, approved club sports associated with WLHS, Cheerleading and Dance team
- Students will earn a Pass or No Pass on their transcript for credits earned.
- After every season rosters are verified and added to students' transcripts.

Athlete's Eligibility Requirements

- Must have taken and passed 5 courses in the previous semester
- Must be taking and passing 5 courses in the current semester



California University Art Requirement

- For University of California and Cal State Schools
- Must complete a full year (2 semesters) of a fine/performing art in same discipline for California university admissions.

Classes Requiring Teacher Approval or Application

Teacher Approval

- Advanced Placement Classes
- World Language levels
- Weight Training II

Application

- Yearbook (Glenn Krake)

Advanced Placement (AP)



- AP classes are based on teacher recommendation.
- AP courses are college level courses that are graded on a weighted scale (i.e. "A" = 5.0, "B" = 4.0, etc. This does not apply to "D" grades).
- National AP exam completion is required at the end of the course. This determines number of college credits the student is eligible for.
- Once enrolled in an AP class, students are expected to complete the class.

Honors Graduate Program

- 6 AP/Honors credits (2 Math/Science and 2 Humanities)
- 3.6 weighted GPA or higher
- Dropping an Honors course, may result in losing Honors status
- Must pass state tests in reading, writing and math
- 20 or more hours of Community Service

Advanced College Credit (ACC)

- Completing ACC approved courses with an "A" or "B" will earn community college credit that can be transferable to many 4 year universities.
- CCC will notify students taking ACC approved courses for registration. Credits cost \$10 each for college credit. (i.e. 4 credit course = \$40).
- Students can NOT receive both ACC and AP credit for the same course.
