

Planning for Graduation

Graduation Requirements

A student must earn at least 24 credits, to participate in Commencement and to receive a diploma. The student must also meet all the state requirements for graduation.

Only those students, who have completed all the requirements for graduation and received 24 credits, will be allowed in the graduation ceremonies. The Principal shall forward exceptions to the Superintendent.
