Update your FlashAlert Subscriptions

Winter weather is approaching. That means it is time to update your FlashAlert subscriptions. FlashAlert is the system that we use to notify you of school closures, delays, and other similar events. The system is routinely pruned of untouched accounts so even if you had previously subscribed, you should verify your subscriptions at https://www.flashalert.net/login.html. Please note that this is not "our" system and we can provide limited help.

You should consider getting the free FlashAlert Messenger app from the Apple AppStore or the Google PlayStore. The announcements will also be displayed on the local TV channels as well. And the "feed" from FlashAlert is available from our district website (www.wlwv.k12.or.us) under the Inclement Weather link.
