West Linn-Wilsonville School District 2023 Proposed Measure

Why was this measure referred to the ballot?

History

This Local Option school tax was originally passed by voters in 2000 and most recently renewed in 2019. During that time, the local option levy has funded classroom teachers, counselors, and support staff. In the 2022-23 fiscal year it funded approximately 90 teachers in the district.

If passed, what would be the cost?

If passed, the Measure would authorize renewal of the current tax of \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. The owner of a median assessed value home of \$500,000 would pay \$62.50 per month or \$750 per year.

If passed, what would the Proposed Measure fund?

If passed, this Measure would provide funds to the District to maintain current programs and staffing levels at schools for 5 years.

The Proposed Measure would:

- ☐ Preserve about 90 classroom teachers, counselors, and support staff
- ☐ Maintain class size and protect class sizes supported by the current Levy
- ☐ Supplement state funding for West Linn-Wilsonville

What happens if the Proposed Measure does not pass?

If the Measure does not pass, the District would not receive the funding as proposed, and the current tax rate of \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed property value would expire in June 2025.
