

Need help formatting your bibliography correctly to APA (or another) style?

Enter the information you have into these handy citation-makers, and then simply copy and paste the result into your project bibliography:

Citation Machine: <http://citationmachine.net/> Select 'APA' on the left, then click on book, journal, website etc. (whatever it is you are citing). Then use the form to enter the author, title, year, and other information you have about your source. When you submit that information Citation Machine will return a nicely formatted version of it to you.

KnightCite: <http://webapps.calvin.edu/knightcite/index.php> Select 'APA' on the left, then click on Print or Electronic on the left. In the list at the left, select book, journal, website, etc. (whatever you are citing). Then use the form on the right to enter the author, title, year, and other information about your source. Click submit, and voila - a nicely formatted citation to copy and paste.

You may also use MLA format, or another style used in biology journals, CBE. The main thing is to pick one style and use it consistently. APA is the most commonly used style in Oregon science expos.
