How to run for ASB:

Step 1- Attend Info Meeting and obtain the application packet

Step 2- Fill out the Application and submit it completed on time by **Friday April 26 by 3:30pm to FLAB**

Step 3- Deliver Teacher Recommendations to your teachers

Step 4- Receive your email confirmation and sign up for an interview time

Step 5- Attend Interview and ROAR recording Session

Step 6- Prepare campaign materials and get them approved

Step 7- Campaign

Step 8- Take Down all Campaign Materials

Step 9- Vote

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Thank you for your interest in running for an ASB position at WLHS. The students who hold these positions play an important role in creating the culture and environment at West Linn and in the greater community. As a member of ASB, you would represent our school and would have significant interactions with your peers, teachers, administrators, school board, and community. You will be in the spotlight, and held to a higher standard than other students and will be asked to put in extra hours for the good of the school and Lion family. You must also be available to **attend planning events in August and prepare for the school year.**

The process for running for ASB office includes three distinct parts: Application, Interview, and Student Vote

The Application is due Friday April 26th 3:30pm.

It contains information about you, your academic standing, attendance, leadership experience, and your aspirations to be a student government officer. It has several parts including questions, teacher recommendations, student signatures, and candidate statements. So please read all the details thoroughly and complete it entirely. **Any application that is incomplete will not be considered!**

Interview: Candidates will have an interview with a panel of teachers, staff and students. They will be asked questions regarding their character, service, and leadership skills. Interviews will take place afterschool on **Monday May 13-** Candidates will be able to sign up for their interview after their application has been approved.

Campaign Week will be May 13-21. **All campaign materials must be approved afterschool on May 13 by the ASB Advisor, Blake Williams.** Signs can be posted afterschool on May 13th and must come down by 3:30pm Tuesday May 21st.

Candidates will be recording a video statement on May 13th that will be played for the student body prior to the Student Vote on May 21st. Your video clip will be recorded at your interview.

There will be 20-24 positions available: approximately 9 seniors, seven juniors, and four sophomores
In order to run for ASB President you must have been on ASB for at least one prior year.
To run for a Commissioner Position you must have taken Leadership 1 or 2 prior.
