Girls' League

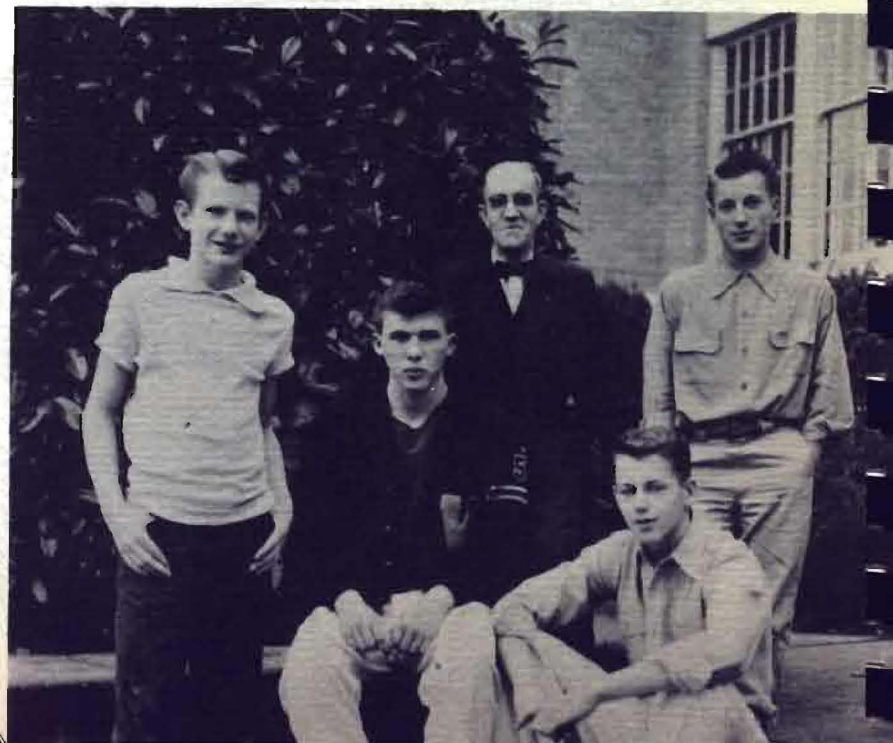
