ACTING II COURSE INFORMATION

OFFICE HOURS: By arrangement

COURSE OBJECTIVES: This course is a continuation of Acting I and will focus on specialty techniques, styles, and genres. Students will analyze and interpret modern theatrical works that span various styles. Students will develop their acting skills through exercises, monologues, and scene work.

COURSE TOPICS AND GUIDING QUESTIONS:

- I. Ensemble Building: How does true ensemble work inform performance?
- **II.** The Magic If: What are the essential ingredients for successful performance? What if you were in the shoes of someone else?
- **III.** The Dramatic Scene: How can an actor enrich emotional memory, which might inform performance?
- **IV.** The Farce: How does rhythm and tempo inform comedic story telling?
- V. Absurdist/Epic Theatre: How can explicit, non-realistic storytelling engage an audience?
- **VI. Dialect**: How do different dialects inform theatrical style and mannerisms?
- **VII. Monologues:** How can vulnerability be advantageous towards successful performance?

The Glass Menagerie by Tennessee Williams
