ACTING I

Group Pantomime Scene

Plan, rehearse, and perform a mimed scene set to <u>instrumental</u> music. It should be between two to three minutes long. You may only use chairs and a table.

- 1. In your group, discuss possibilities and decide on a storyline that has a clear story and vibrant characters. Map out the story by writing bullet points of a beginning, middle, and end.
- 2. Each actor should do a character analysis. Who are you? What do you want? How are you going to get what you want?
- 3. Decide on the actions that will be mimed. Make them specific. Choreograph and rehearse every aspect of the scene as if it were a dance. Set up your environment with levels and planes.
- 4. <u>Choose music.</u> It should be instrumental, or without lyrics, and should set the mood of your scene. Your actions should fit with the music. (Think of it as a silent movie). I have a decent library, so ask. But also check out You Tube.
- 5. Rehearse. Rehearse.
- 6. Choose a creative title for your scene.
- 7. You will have approximately five class periods to rehearse and fine-tune. Perform for the class on the designated day (TBD).

You will be graded on the following:

STORY – did you have a clear plot structure and was it effectively communicated?

PANTOMIME – Was the scene enacted with an understanding of the *Six Properties*?

OBJECTIVE – Is what you WANT clearly communicated?

USE OF THE STAGE – Are the areas of the stage used effectively? Are the levels, planes, and body positions creative and appropriate to the scene? CONTENT – Is the content of the scene appropriate for class? Is the story inventive?

OVERALL PERFORMANCE – Is it of the highest quality? (focused and committed)

COLLABORATION – All groups will be evaluated on the rehearsal/planning process as well as the final performance.
