AGENT OF CHANGE: _____

*For completing your biosketch sheet, you will be collecting at least **FIVE** various sources to discover key information about your AGENT OF CHANGE.*

ONE source must be an “.edu”,

TWO Sources must be “.org”

TWO Sources can be any domain

FINAL PRODUCT: needs to be a typed Chicago style annotated bibliography with *annotations*. **(GO TO: <http://www.citationmachine.net/chicago/cite-a-journal>) OR make your own using this format:**
Author or owner of site Last name first. "Title of Document." Name of Site. URL (date accessed)

Annotations: Identify if the source is either primary or secondary. Answer and discuss if the collected source is credible, supported, biased, stereotyping, or features misrepresentation. Lastly, summarize or discuss what information relating to your topic was discovered through this source = what information you used from that source for completing your biosketch sheet.
