2. Why was this article written? - Is it discussing research or describing a concept?
3. Is the article a primary source (written by the people who did the work), or a secondary source? Explain how you determine this.
4. What is the main topic of the article?
5. Does the article have a point of view? Can you determine the author's background or how the author feels about the topic?
6. What is the question being examined by the researchers? If no question is discussed what are some possible questions that could be asked regarding this information?
