The process for the Dual Language lottery is described below. Please note the underlined dates for communicating results to families and confirming acceptance into the program.

- 1. All children with completed Dual Language applications and registration are entered into "school location preference" lists as indicated by parents' preferences on their registration form.
- 2. Families who indicated "either" or checked both locations on the application form have their child's name placed on both schools' lists.
- 3. Families who have twins are called before the lottery for their preference to have their children placed on the same number or on separate numbers for the lottery.
- The lottery operates as such: each student is randomly assigned a computer-generated 6-digit number and then the computer sorts the numbers in rank order (smallest to largest) to create the list.
- 5. This computerized lottery process will occur for each school list.
- 6. Lowrie is a Two-Way Dual Language program, so there are two enrollment lists, one for Native English-speaking students and one for Native Spanish-speaking students. Approximately half of the class is represented by each native language group. At this time, there is space to accommodate all the Native Spanish-speaking children who have applied. We will hold a lottery for the Native English-speaking students, because there is more interest than space available. The program at Trillium Creek is primarily a One-Way immersion program as almost all of the students are native English speakers, learning Spanish as their second language. The lottery for Trillium will include all students who applied.
- 7. Staff will contact families individually to inform them of the results of the lottery. After the lottery process is complete, the lists of students will be organized by staff to: create the class lists based on rank order numbers; cross-check those marked "either" to eliminate duplication; create a wait list; and begin sending notification to parents on <u>March 18</u> or sooner.
- 8. The lottery for Trillium Creek occurs first. A list of student names is presented before the computer randomization process occurs. A computer application is then used to assign a random number to each student and the list is sorted by rank order.
- 9. The lottery for Lowrie Primary occurs next. A list of student names is presented before the computer randomization process occurs. A computer application is then used to assign a random number to each student and the list is sorted by rank order.
- 10. Letters will be sent to all families giving notice as to whether their child is in the class or on a wait list. Parents must confirm intent to accept in the Dual Language program by <u>April 1, 4:00 p.m.</u>
