Estimated Project Costs, Details & School by School Project Lists

If Passed, the Total Proposed Capital Improvement Investment: \$206.8 Million

Renovate & Repair Aging **Building Systems District Wide**

Replace aging roofs, windows, paint, flooring, mechanical/electrical systems, and energy-saving improvements

Est. \$13.25 Million

Safety & Security

The proposed projects would include school building renovations for secure school entrances; classroom lockdown hardware; shelter-in-place curtains; and intrusion-limiting glass. Those improvements would be made for all 16 WLWV schools

Est. \$15.25 Million

Upgrade & Update Technology

Upgrade technology and technology infrastructure throughout the District

Est. \$18 Million

Relieve Crowded Classrooms, Plan For Growth at the Primary Level

Build a new primary school on the District-owned Frog Pond property in Wilsonville to accommodate projected enrollment growth

Est. \$39 Million

Relieve Crowded Classrooms. Plan For Growth at **Secondary Level**

Relocate and expand Arts and Technology High School to the Athey Creek Middle School site to accommodate projected enrollment growth and increase Career and Technical Education opportunities

Relocate and build Athey Creek Middle School to the Districtowned Dollar Street property in West Linn

Est. \$88 Million

Increase stadium capacity and the building of additional parking at West Linn High School

Est. \$8.3 Million

Expand Access to the Arts

Wilsonville High School auditorium addition

Est. \$25 Million

If the Bond does not pass, the safety and security, infrastructure, repair and renovation projects outlined in this guide would not be completed and the property tax assessment would not be made

If passed, the bond and levy would

Maintain Current Tax Rates

The current levy rate of \$1.50 per \$1,000 and current bond rate of \$3 per \$1,000 assessed value would remain unchanged if both were passed.


Provide Independent Oversight
