WHS Online Forecasting 2021-2022

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How do I log-on to StudentVUE?

A: Go to your school's webpage. In the upper-right-corner select StudentVUE. Username: Student email address. Password: Students create their password.

Q: I tried to log-on to StudentVUE, but it is not working- what should I do?

A: Please reach out to your school's main office.

Q: What math class should I forecast for?

A: We recommend that you ask your current math teacher which class they would recommend for 9th grade, but typically, if a student is in Algebra, they will forecast for Geometry, and if a student is in Geometry, they will forecast for Adv. Algebra. Review the <u>Curriculum Guide</u> for course descriptions.

Q: What science class should I forecast for?

A: All 9th grade students take Biology. If you are a student who speaks Spanish, or a student who is in the dual language program, you are welcome to forecast for Biology-Spanish.

Q: What if I want to take AP Human Geography instead of World History?

A: Great! You are welcome to select it in your online forecasting. Please remember that it is a year-long class and will fill two semester spots in your schedule.

Q: What World Language level should I forecast for?

A: If you are planning to take Chinese, French, or Japanese, please forecast for Chinese I, French I, or Japanese I. If you have taken Spanish in middle school, you are welcome to forecast for either Spanish I or II. Typically, students who have taken three years of middle school Spanish are prepared for Spanish II. If you are a student who speaks Spanish or is in the dual language program, please forecast for Spanish Language & Literature I.

Q: What are Alternates?

A: Alternates are the classes that you would be excited and willing to take if your first-choice electives are unavailable. We ask that you provide three alternates.

Q: When and how can I register for summer school? What course will be offered?

A: Summer school will be from Thursday, June 24 to Friday, July 16, 2021. Students can register beginning on Monday, April 19 on the main WHS website. Course options include:

- Comprehensive Distance Learning:
 - Health 1 and Health 2
 - Combination of synchronous and asynchronous learning
 - o Monday-Friday: 8:30-11:30 am
- Traditional In-Person Learning:
 - o Art I and PE
 - o Monday-Thursday: 8:30-11:30 am
 - o Friday: At-home learning
- Bridging Pathways

Q: What if I don't know what classes to pick, can my high school counselor help me?

A: Of course! Please see the *Connect with Your School Counseling Team* on your grade-level google classroom (ujbz6xc) or the WHS webpage and reach out to your school counselor either through email or text.

Q: Can I request that my high school counselor "review" my forecasting selections to make sure they are correct?

A: Yes! Please email or text with your high school counselor and we will log-on to your forecasting to review your course selections.

Q: Once I submit my forecasting, can I still make changes?

A: Yes! You can make changes anytime in StudentVUE until Friday, April 16. After April 16, please email your high school counselor with any forecasting changes. You have until the end of the school year to make any changes.

Q: What if I'm not planning to attend WHS next year? Should I still forecast?

A: Yes! We recommend that you still forecast in case your plans change.
