COMMUNITY, DISTRICT, & HIGH SCHOOL

Wilsonville is a growing community of approximately 25,000 residents located between Portland and Salem. Wilsonville is home to some of Oregon's largest and most influential corporate citizens including Coca Cola Distribution Center, Flir Systems, Inc., Mentor Graphics, Oregon Institute of Technology, Rockwell Collins, Sysco Food Systems, and Xerox. The West Linn-Wilsonville School District is a K-12 public school system with approximately 10,000 students.

Established in 1995, WHS is a four-year comprehensive high school serving 1220 students in grades 9-12. It is accredited by the Northwest Association of Secondary Schools and has four administrators, four school counselors, 66 teachers, and 24 classified staff members. The school year is organized into two 18-week semesters with six classes per semester.

COVID-19 IMPACT

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, all Oregon schools closed from March 16, 2020 through the end of the school year. Instruction was delivered via distance learning. Per the direction and guidance of the Oregon Department of Education, grades for second semester were recorded as either a Pass or an Incomplete. For the 2020-2021 school year, the instructional model will be organized into four 9-week quarters with three classes per quarter. Students will earn .5 credit or semester credit for each quarter class.

POST-SECONDARY PLANS

The Class of 2020 reported that 27% would attend a two-year or community college and 54% would attend a four-year college or university.

Graduation Requirements

Students are expected to earn a total of 24 credits to graduate. Students earn .5 credit for each semester course that is passed with a 60% or better.

Grade Point Average and Class Rank

A cumulative GPA is computed for each student based on grades received in all courses taken in grades 9-12. Class rank is computed using the quality points listed below. Students in AP courses who take the AP exam earn an additional 1.0 quality point. AP courses are indicated by an 'AP' appearing before the course title on the transcript. All students are ranked at the end of the 6th, 7th, and 8th semesters. The 7th semester rank is what determines the valedictorian.

Advanced Placement Courses

Since 2002-03, WHS has been one of the toprated Oregon schools for AP participation as measured by the AP Challenge Index. In 2019-2020, 41% of students in grades 9-12 were enrolled in at least one AP class. Courses include: Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Computer Science Principles, Calculus AB & BC, Economics, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, Environmental Science, French, Government & Politics, Human Geography, Physics I, Physics C, Psychology, Spanish, Statistics, Studio Art: 2D Design, Studio Art: 3D, US History, and World History.

Dual Credit

Wilsonville High School offers several dual credit opportunities. Students can earn credit through Clackamas Community College for Art IV, AP English Composition and Literature, AP Studio Art, Discrete B, French III and IV, Graphic Arts I/II, Pre-Calculus, Spanish III and IV and Automotive Technology. Dual credit through Portland Community College for Spanish Language and Literature. Dual credit through Oregon Tech for AP Chemistry and AP Physics I.
