COMMUNITY and DISTRICT

Wilsonville, located between Portland and Salem, is a growing community of approximately 23,768. Wilsonville is home to some of Oregon's largest and most influential corporate citizens including Adecco USA Inc., Coca Cola Distribution Center, Flir Systems, Inc., Fry's Electronics, Mentor Graphics, ODS Headquarters, Oregon Institute of Technology, Sysco Food Systems and Xerox. The West Linn-Wilsonville School District covers 42 square miles and includes two towns, West Linn and Wilsonville, in Clackamas County. The district is a K-12 public school system with approximately 10,000 students.

HIGH SCHOOL

Wilsonville High School, established in 1995, is a four-year comprehensive public high school serving 1203 students in grades 9-12. It is accredited by the Northwest Association of Secondary Schools (CEEb code 381258) and organizes the school year with two 18-week semesters with four 9-week grading periods with six periods per day. Wilsonville High School has four administrators, 65 certified teachers, four counselors and 25 classified staff members.

ACADEMICS

The Class of 2017 reported that 27% would attend a two year or community college and 53% would attend a four year college or university. In 2015-2016, the State of Oregon initiated the Oregon Promise Grant.

Graduation Requirements

Students are expected to earn a total of 24 credits to graduate. Students earn .5 credit for each semester course that is passed.

Grade Point Average and Class Rank

A cumulative GPA is computed for each student based on grades received in all courses taken in grades 9-12. Class rank is computed using the quality points listed below. Students in AP courses who take the AP exam earn an additional 1.0 quality point. AP courses are indicated by an 'AP' appearing before the course title on the transcript. All students are ranked at the end of the 6th, 7th, and 8th semesters. The 7th semester rank is sent to all colleges to which a student has applied.

Advanced Placement Courses

Since 2002-03, Wilsonville High School has been one of the top rated Oregon schools for AP participation as measured by the AP Challenge Index. In 2016-2017, 37% of students in grades 9-12 were enrolled in at least one AP class. Courses include: Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Computer Science Principles, Calculus AB & BC, Economics, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, Environmental Science, French, Government & Politics, Human Geography, Physics I, Physics C, Psychology, Spanish, Statistics, Studio Art: Drawing, Studio Art: 2D Design, Music Theory, US History and World History.

Advanced College Credit

Advanced College Credit is granted through Clackamas Community College for the following courses: Art IV, AP English Composition and Literature, AP Studio Art, French III and IV, Graphic Arts, Pre-Calculus, Spanish III and IV and World of Speed (automotive classes).
