On Wednesday, September 20, students, staff, and parents at Boones Ferry Primary will have the opportunity to spend time with children's advocate and award-winning author Trudy Ludwig. Trudy has been featured on ABC's "Good Morning America," PBS's nationally syndicated show, "Keeping Kids Healthy," Wall Street Journal, Huffington Post, Reading Rainbow, the National Crime Prevention Council's Circle of Respect program, and has served as an expert panel member on Sesame Street Workshop's video series



addressing bullying. Her books (My Secret Bully, Just Kidding, Sorry!, Trouble Talk®, Too Perfect, Confessions of a Former Bully, Better Than You, The Invisible Boy and Gifts from the Enemy) have received national praise for helping children cope with and thrive in their social world.

In each of her student assemblies at our school, Trudy will read one of her books to the audience and discuss the story and the characters' roles. Through engaging, age-appropriate activities and role-play with the author, the children will learn important life skills related to making healthy friendship choices.

New Volunteer Registration Process

As we launch this school year, we are rolling out a new, updated process for volunteer registration and sign-in. Although the system will look very similar to the system you may have used in the past, the system is now implemented in a district wide fashion.

Among other things, this means that you can register on your own. Simply visit http://www.helpcounter.net/wlwv and click **Start** to fill out your application. Your registration will be received at our district office where it will be processed.

The first time that you actually sign-in to volunteer at any of our schools, you will be prompted to accept a Volunteer Agreement (attached). In order to speed up the sign-in process, please review the agreement ahead of time. Accepting of the agreement is a one-time task to be completed at any school.

As you complete the sign-in process each time you volunteer, the system will print a name badge for you. This needs to be worn at all times while you are serving in your volunteer capacity.

Thank you for your willingness to share your time, enthusiasm, and skills with our students. Last year parents and community members logged thousands of volunteer hours. Your efforts, and the collective efforts of our volunteers, help make our schools exceptional.

To support our collective efforts, please review the following Volunteer Guidelines.

Professionalism

Although the job is voluntary, the commitment is professional. Besides being responsible for maintaining an attitude of mutual respect and confidence, you should also become familiar with school and classroom practices. Working with the teaching staff requires flexibility and a willingness to follow directions. Also, while we understand that life happens, we want our staff and volunteers to be completely present when they are in our building or supporting teachers and students. Accordingly, please try to limit use of your cell phones while at school.

Identification

To ensure the safety of our students, all volunteers need to sign in and out in the office each day and wear a school name tag (available when checking in) at all times. Adults not wearing proper identification should be directed to the office.

Sight and Sound

Volunteers and visitors operate under the direction of staff, and should be within sight and sound of a staff member at all times.

Privacy and Confidentiality

Volunteers must protect students' and staffs' right to privacy at all times - this includes privacy of settings and circumstances, as well as privacy of student data that a volunteer may come into contact with. Volunteers may not disclose school information or personal matters that may have been overheard or observed. Questions or concerns should be discussed with staff members you are working with or the building principal. Volunteers may not take or share photos/videos of students without the permission of the principal or supervising staff member.



All volunteers will be required to accept these agreements when signing in before being allowed to volunteer.
