
## **Los Pronombres**



## Notes:

\*\*\* Tú and Usted mean the exact same thing: YOU

\*\*\* Tú is used in an informal setting (friends, family, kids), and Usted is used in a formal setting (a stranger, authority figure, adults).

\*\*\*To say the plural of Tú and Usted, use "<u>Ustedes</u>", which means "YOU GUYS" or "YOU ALL"

\*\*\*In Spain, they only use Ustedes in formal situations. In informal situations, they use Vosotros. Vosotros disappeared in Latin America, so they use Ustedes for any time you're talking to more than one person. Think of it this way:

When talking **TO** a goup of people, use **Ustedes**.

When talking **ABOUT** a goup of people, use **Ellos** or **Ellas**.

\*\*\*If a group has all females, you must changes the ending to an **AS**. (Nosotr<u>as</u>, Ell<u>as</u>). If the group is mixed male/female, the OS ending applies.
