


How will Students Demonstrate Learning?

We have many options ... what is best for the student?

<p>Passing an exam or completing a work product to demonstrate essential learning.</p>	<p>Independent studies centering on a project that incorporates priority standards from one or more courses in order for students to earn credit in more than one course.</p>	<p>Extended time for learning, such as an optional course period or a for-credit project must be complete prior to the 2021-2022 school year</p>	<p>Demonstrating mastery through successful completion of the next course in the learning progression.</p>	
<p>Be flexible and allow students to select the mode of response to match their context, strengths, and interests.</p>	<p>Families with mobile devices may take photos of work or use drop off sites or self-addressed, stamped mail from the district.</p>	<p>Incorporate multiple opportunities to collect evidence of learning over time (e.g., project-based learning, voice recordings, artifacts, self-assessment, community service projects, interdisciplinary work, student-designed projects, rubrics).</p>	<p>Focus on holistic judgments that incorporate the totality of opportunities to learn and evidence of learning collected.</p>
