

During the week of May 17th through May 20th- 319 sixth graders in the West Linn Wilsonville School district participated in a bird search in their neighborhoods. Each student collected data for 45-60 minutes in West Linn or Wilsonville, Oregon. Data was shared with the Friends of the Tualatin River Wildlife Refuge and the Portland Audubon Society. During this citizen science effort students collected data on three things:

- 1.) If their neighborhood had key features of bird habitat (FOOD, SHELTER, COVER, and SPACE)
- 2) how many birds they saw and/or heard
- 3) what types of birds they saw




