Two Options for 2021-22 School Year

- All Students Stay Enrolled at Their Neighborhood School
- Principal, Office, Counselor and Specialist Provide Support to All Students
 - All students Attend Neighborhood School Activities, Events, Clubs
- All Students Access District Meal Service and Receive Their Neighborhood School ListServ

Option One: On Site School With Blended Learning Options

Student learns in person at school



- Grades Pre-K - 12
- Students access their classroom teachers, co-curricular activities, and traditional school experiences fully on campus, every day, in person.
- Class schedule and pace are determined by district calendar and teacher, working with students.
- Students have opportunities for individualized learning and use of digital tools within their regular school classrooms.

Optional Blended Learning



- Grades 9-12
- Students may elect to take 1-2 blended courses while enrolled in traditional school.
- Each school will offer several blended courses designed with a blend of some remote sessions and some on-site sessions.
- Some courses will be more structured with more direct teacher instruction for whole class participation, interactions, and aligned pacing.
- Some courses will be less structured with less direct teacher instruction, more individualized, and student can determine own pace towards completion.

Option Two: Remote School WLWV K12 Online Academy (WKOA)

Students learn at home



- Grades K-12
- Students stay enrolled at their neighborhood school but engage full-time using virtual academy (K12Stride).
- The parent/guardian is the student's main learning coach.
- A WLWV teacher is assigned to each student/family to oversee the learning plan, check in during the week, help maintain connection to school and activities, and assist with any technical or academic concerns.
- Class schedule and pace are determined by student and parent in consultation with school staff.
- Students are encouraged to stay enrolled in the Online Academy for the entire 2021-22 school year. Any transitions would be discussed and arranged with the school principal.
