	control side as well as fan speeds to achieve the right balance to keep		
	the radon levels low but also still providing heat to the building.

	Currently testing in the C porch and all results lately have been		
	below the threshold. Will continue to test and will also test during		
	the summer.		
•	Testing lead in water at 6 locations. Have tested at Willamette,

	received some results back of tests being over the threshold. When		
	we receive those, we remove and replace the fixture that tested		
	above the threshold, after replacing we retest.

- OSHA is going to be more active in their inspection and enforcement actions. They would like districts to investigate all accidents and every injury report. The Safety Committee will be tasked with investigating those.
- Safety and Security Supervisor, Jeremy Nicholas, has been appointed to the District Safety Leadership Team.
