#### 9.21.2022

- The long lead items are still preventing us from finishing Trillium Creek and WLHS. The projects are on the schedule & orders placed. Hoping for over Christmas Break but won't finalize the schedule until we have the parts.
- Construction area at WHS has been burglarized twice now. What can we do to help crack down on security?

#### 10.19.2022

- Meeting tonight with Long Range Planning. One of the items that will be discussed is site fencing – specifically at primary schools. To increase site security. Will have many community conversations also recommendation from True North. Having conversations with PTAs throughout the district.
- New line item for True North.

#### 11.16.2022

Ongoing discussions with PTAs about installing site fencing at schools. Have received good feedback but with certain stipulations.

#### 12.21.2022

- Meetings with PTA groups are going well. Will be meeting with Boeckman Creek and Willamette PTA in January.
- The District is moving forward with renovations for Riverside HS.

#### 1.18.2023

- PTA visits have been completed at all primary schools regarding fencing at the primary school sites. Great feedback regarding fencing.

#### Safety, Security, and Technology Upgrades

#### 6.15.2022

Operations has trained all staff that have the shelter lock system other than Athey Creek.

#### 7.20.2022

All schools with shelter lock system have been trained. Operations still needs to meet with Athey Creek & will also meet with schools to go over the training again in the first weeks of school.

#### 9.21.2022

All schools have had the training/re-training on the shelter lock system. Have created buzz-in systems for schools as well.

#### 10.19.2022

All schools have buzz in entry, two schools waiting for two sites that can unlock doors. Also, adding a button in that will allow doors to shut when lockdown occurs.

<ul> <li>IT has implemented a new pre-drill announcement that will go out on the PA system before every drill (fire, shelter, lockdown) so that everyone knows a drill is occurring.</li> <li>Also have rolled out a 'softer' all clear announcement at each school.</li> <li>Would be great to have some protocols in place for building engineers to understand their roles in drills. Often when there is a sub for an engineer they are unsure what to do. Having an outlined protocol sheet would be beneficial.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>The District hired a new Environmental Technician. She has been working on updating Radon maps. Testing will begin in January at two schools. We'll begin water testing in the Spring in seven buildings. Testing for radon and lead is part of the HASS plan and being compliant.</li> <li>The IPM report will be presented to the Board at the February Board Meeting.</li> <li>1.18.2023</li> <li>Radon testing at Wood and Lowrie in February. Water testing to occur after the radon testing, 7 schools to have water testing.</li> <li>Maintenance is also putting fence guard at numerous locations – just finished at Cedaroak and are currently working at Boeckman Creek.</li> <li>2.15.2023</li> <li>In the process of radon testing. - 2. Stafford has an accidental shelter initiated from the FOBS and staff in the annex building were concerned that they were not notified. In a real situation if there were to be a lockdown they would be notified by the shelter lock notifications.
