•	Current manufacturer is no longer making these shelter lock systems which creates some problems moving forward. There is a new system, so the district is speaking about implementing that. If they		
	do it will need a board action approval to proceed.

•	Current manufacturer of shelter lock system is no longer making these lock systems. We have a new product in the works and the Board recently approved this.		
•	Installed vape detectors in bathrooms at high schools. Likely to expand and install more of these in the high school and middle

	on the PA system before every drill (fire, shelter, lockdown) so that		
	everyone knows a drill is occurring.		
•	Also have rolled out a 'softer' all clear announcement at each school.		
•	Would be great to have some protocols in place for building		
	engineers to understand their roles in drills. Often when there is a		
	sub for an engineer they are unsure what to do. Having an outlined

•	Some staff members are concerned that if we always notify students		
	before the drills then in a real emergency they won't really know		
	what to do. This should be a building decision if they want to not

We'll begin water testing in the Spring in seven buildings. Testing for radon and lead is part of the HASS plan and being compliant. The IPM report will be presented to the Board at the February Board Meeting.

 Tested Wood for radon and all results came back under threshold in all spaces. Radon testing at Lowrie came back high in one classroom. The history of readings and the levels of which the HVAC was running are contributors into the testing results. The District has numerous organizations working to remedy this situation. 4.19.2023 Testing the C-porch at Lowrie at different intervals and seeing how the results correlate to the HVAC settings and different time intervals. Continuing to have meetings regarding the radon results and the solutions the district can provide to mediate or minimalize the radon levels. During the summer the district will be making adjustments to the
