We have officially collected well over one hundred applications for the Science Inquiry Fair this year at Trillium Creek. That is an exciting number of projects to anticipate display on February 22nd, but what is most exciting is the culture of question sharing and the thinking out loud that has been swirling in and around the library lately. When one person begins to wonder, we find that others readily join in. And when authentic inquiry is present, it is hard to stop – and that is a good thing.

Although the Science Inquiry Fair happens each February at Trillium Creek, the encouragement of authentic inquiry is present all year long. Setting the stage for inquiry is part of our work as teachers. Much like offering students the chance to experience productive struggle so they may see the success and feel the satisfaction that comes with persevering, the generating of purposeful questions stemming from genuine curiosity is a thinking disposition we model as teachers, and strive to build into the culture of our school.

We model for students that inquiry is cyclical in nature because the outcome of inquiry is not simple answers, but rather developed understandings that often lead to new questions and new trajectories in learning. Learning is powerful when one experience may be connected to another. The modeling of inquiry thinking prompts students to process their understanding of a concept by actively engaging in more questions about that concept. So when I hear a student say, "Why is it 5:00 in Oregon, but 8:00 in North Carolina?" I smile and think, this is a question that will most certainly lead to more questions while in pursuit of an understanding. The next time you hear your child musing about something, honor that spark of curiosity and wonder out loud together.

CREST-JANE GOODALL SCIENCE SYMPOSIUM

The 16th annual CREST-Jane Goodall Science Symposium will be held at Wilsonville High School, 6800 SW Wilsonville Rd., Wilsonville, OR, on Monday and Tuesday, February 27-28, 2017. The ISEF-affiliated fair is a highlight of the event. During the fair each year, professional scientists and engineers from our community volunteer their time as judges spend a day reviewing the projects and interviewing our student scientists and engineers, to discuss their work and determine special and category award winners. The awards and the names of the students who will advance to the state-level fair and the international ISEF fair will be announced on the evening of Tuesday, February 28, following the keynote address by geoscientist Dr. Chris Goldfinger.



Dear West Linn-Wilsonville School Community,

2016-2017 School Calendar Amendment

This winter West Linn-Wilsonville School District lost instructional time due to inclement weather in December and January. We believe strongly in our commitment to student learning and have been exploring options that help us restore a full academic calendar that puts student learning as a priority and fulfills the state instructional hour mandates.

We have received a great many suggestions from the community regarding which options for restoring lost time will keep student learning a priority; provide the least disruption to family plans; keep the extension of the calendar into June at a minimum, avoiding conflict with Seniors' graduation (June 13th, 14th 15th) as well as significant impact on critical summer bond projects, specifically the opening of Meridian Creek Middle School and Sunset Primary School, for the start of the new school year.

Some options we heard from the community included adding days in June, adding minutes to the school day, eliminating a portion of spring break, eliminating professional development and conference days, adjusting finals schedules, extending Seniors' last day (which we can only do until June 13th). We realize that not all options will meet universal approval; however, a combination of some of the options can help us reach our goal.

The district staff has worked carefully and thoughtfully to calculate, accommodate and restore the lost hours at each level which help us keep student learning a priority and meet the state requirement for instructional hours for the 2016-2017 school year.

On January 31st, the School Board approved these amendments to the 2016-2017 school calendar to fulfill these goals:

- Early Release Days (January 18, February 8, March 22, April 26 and May 24) become full student school days
- April 10th Staff Development Day cancelled; student school day instead
- March 23rd Conference Day for K-5 cancelled; student school day instead
- March 24th Conference Day for G. 6-8 cancelled; student school day instead
- High school students adjust finals schedule in February and June as well as shortened lunch schedule (restores 2.5 days)
- Seniors' last day of school extended to June 13th (from June 9th)
- Two days of school added in June for Grades K-11; Last day of school is Tuesday, June 20th

Each of these decisions was made with full awareness of the cost to lost valuable professional development time for teachers; communication time between parents and teachers; and time for grading and teacher collaboration. At the same time, these options restore learning time for students that is needed during the months prior to June while also keeping the calendar from

extending too late into June impacting Senior graduation; families' summer plans; district summer school programs; college/university summer schedules for students and staff; and district summer construction plans.

We are not out of the winter season yet! Should any additional school closures occur, we will re-evaluate available options at that time.

Middle School Boundary Adjustment Update

On the evening of January 25th, the School Board heard an overview and proposal of the Middle School Boundary Adjustment from the Superintendent upon recommendation from the Boundary Task Force. A new scenario for boundary adjustments, Map 9A, was presented and is available for public viewing and comment on the district website. You will notice that "*choice schools*" have been proposed and an "Implementation FAQ" explaining Map 9A, choice schools, student transition, busing and transfers is also available for public viewing and comment.



The School Board will deliberate and take action regarding approval of the Middle School Boundary Adjustment at the next regular board meeting, February 6th.

The parents and patrons on the Task Force volunteered their time and we are immensely grateful to their interest, commitment and actions in serving our community.
