Statewide Assessments in May

Students in third, fourth and fifth grades will take the Oregon statewide assessments in the areas of Math and Reading this month. Fifth graders will also be assessed in Science. These assessments provide an indicator of whether or not children are meeting their grade level benchmarks and are one piece of information about a child's learning.

While we always ask that you help your child arrive at school on-time, well-rested and well-nourished, please be especially conscious of doing this on the days that your child is scheduled to participate in statewide assessments. We would like this measure to reflect your child's best work. Please watch for emails and other communication from your child's teacher regarding the testing schedule. We also ask that you avoid scheduling any appointments that would cause your child to miss school on those days. Thank you for working together with us to gather accurate information about your child's learning.

Your child may come home and talk to you about his/her experience with these assessments. As you discuss this with your child, please remember that this is a summative measure of content area knowledge and skills. While it is an indicator of your child's mastery of grade level content, it is not a measure of growth per se. Nor does it measure all of the skills and dispositions that are important to being a strong learner and a successful student. Help your child view the assessments as an opportunity to show what they have learned and how they are able to independently apply their learning.

WEST LINN OLD TIME FAIR STUFFED ANIMAL COLLECTION


This is Princess Grace Heaton wanting to give you a reminder about the Stuffed Animal Drive at your school!

2017-18 Class Placement Information

As we strive to create powerful learning experiences each year for all children, we are beginning to think about classroom communities and placements for next year. In order to do this, it's important to know the number of children who will be with us in each grade level. If you and your family are planning to move, please contact our school office (503-673-7950) so that we are aware of this. Likewise, if you know of families moving into our school community boundaries, call the office and please encourage your neighbor to register now for next year. Children must be 5 years old by September 1 for Kindergarten. By having enrollment numbers early, we hope to have accurate staffing ratios this spring and fewer changes in staffing next fall.

Next month we will begin the process for classroom placements. We give this complex process a great deal of time and thought to set every child up for success. We strive to create balanced classroom communities with a range of student strengths and talents. The class placement process is one based on respect for every child, teacher, and parent at our school. The goal of the placement process is to develop new learning communities that serve the needs of all of our students by creating classes where children, parents, and teachers work together. Each classroom community includes students with a variety of skill levels and experiences. We consider academic skills, social and emotional development, and gender in order to develop balanced classes and a community where every child has an opportunity to thrive.

Your classroom teacher already knows a great deal about your child. However, if you would like to provide information about your child to be used in placement, return the <u>optional Parent Information Form</u> attached to this newsletter to the office <u>by Monday, May 8th</u>. While we do not fulfill specific teacher requests, parents have valuable information to share and offer in this process. We welcome your input concerning your child including areas of needed growth, social needs, strengths, concerns, and the type of learning community necessary for your child to thrive. Therefore, do not request specific teachers. We have found that this may not always work to meet a child's needs, and it can set unrealistic expectations.

If you do fill out the Parent Information Form, your child's teacher and the placement team, consisting of grade level teachers, specialists, and the principal, will read each form and consider the information working together to create balanced learning communities. We want you to know that we think deeply about each student and that teachers put a great deal of thought into every single class placement!

We do our best to make sure every class has many opportunities for friendships. Due to a variety of circumstances, we cannot promise friends being together in the same class. If you do list friends, it's best to list several. We encourage children to be with children other than their current friends so that they learn new skills and make new friends, a lifetime skill.

Creating classroom placements is an important step in building a strong learning community. The placement team will work together to make balanced classes so all children will have success! We appreciate you trusting and supporting our placement team in this process as we work together to serve the children at Trillium Creek. Parents and students will receive their class placement the week prior to the start of school in the fall. This next year school will start on Tuesday, August 29.

Again, if you know of anyone moving from our school community, please let us know.

Update for Count Me In Campaign

Each year the Count



campaign raises money to hire and retain new teaching positions for our school district. Added to our already dedicated and highly-qualified teaching staff, these new positions help lower class sizes, expand our curriculum and provide our students with more individualized attention. The WLWV School District is highly sought after as one of the very best in Oregon with new families moving here throughout the year. As we enjoy this growth, it is important that we maintain this excellence for every child, for each child. Our District annually uses more than 80% of its operating budget for staffing. Having a continuing local source of funds that supplement what the district receives from the state and through local option funds is critical for providing the quality that defines WLWV schools.

As of April 23rd, the total contributions are \$28,858.50 or 29% of our overall goal. At Trillium Creek, we have reached **34% of our target goal from 21 donors**. 
