Norma Torres will be our 5<sup>th</sup> grade teacher in the dual language program. She comes to us after immigrating from Cuba where she was a special education teacher, speech language therapist, computer science teacher and a 5<sup>th</sup> grade teacher. After moving to Portland with her family in 2008, Norma taught at a Montessori School and has spent the past seven years as a classroom teacher at the International School. She's taken various workshops and classes on The Zones of Regulation, Differentiating Instruction, Formative Assessment, The Writing Traits, and Literacy models. She uses the Calkins Units of Study in her current teaching position. As you can tell, Norma will be a wonderful asset to Trillium Creek and the dual language program.

In addition, I am opening a 3<sup>rd</sup> grade classroom position. This will allow us to have five third grade classes and four classes at each of the other grade levels.
