## **Summer Reading**

My message today is about reading. I know we all love going to our library. This summer, our West Linn Public Library will host a special reading program for three age groups: birth to 5<sup>th</sup> grade, teens and adults. To complete the program, kids must read 20 minutes a day for 25 days adding up to a total of 500 minutes. Teens are expected to read a total of 1,000 minutes or 40 minutes a day, and adults must read 1,500 minutes. You can do this by reading fiction, nonfiction or graphic novels or listening to audio books. The important idea is that you read each day.

In past summers, kids have gone to weekly meetings at the library. This summer on Tuesdays from 2:00-4:00 in the afternoon, the library staff will meet with kids at Willamette Park. This has more space for all who will participate in the summer reading program. The program will begin on June 19th and end August 31st. Not only do you win because you are reading good books, there are prizes like a free book for completing the program.

Also, when you attend the Tuesday meeting at Willamette Park, you will enjoy visits from Presto the Magician, Jugglemania, 'pioneers' from the West Linn Historical Society, and other fun presenters. Those who complete the program will receive a raffle ticket for larger prizes like giant stuffed animals, OMSI family membership, Oregon Zoo membership, and a gift certificate to Powell's Books. Next week, the librarian from the West Linn Public Library will come to Trillium Creek Primary to tell us more and get us excited to read this summer. I hope you all participate in summer reading.

This year, in addition to inviting librarians from the West Linn library to talk about the public library's Summer Reading Program, we also hope students will launch into a summer of reading with a gently used book from our Trillium Creek Book Swap. Promoting a summer of literacy, is not only limited to reading books, but also listening to stories.
