Good Afternoon! Tomorrow we will be finishing our first full week of school. We started with *Kid President* reminding us to be great thinkers, to change the world, to make history and be awesome! I loved one of his quotes, '*Life is school and you've gotta show up!*'

As the week went along, Ms. Soriano and I met with each grade level for a TRRFCC Talk (Terrific Talk) based on the Six Pillars of Character. Depending on the grade level, we read stories about including others in games and conversation and filling one another's buckets with kind thoughts and deeds both at school and at home. She also presented tools to use when something happens that is not respectful or kind. Classroom teachers started their Second Step Curriculum lessons focusing on teaching skills for social and academic success will be taught throughout the school year in four areas: skills for learning, empathy, emotional management and friendship skills and problem solving.

On Wednesday, we had our first PTA meeting with 40 families attending. This was a great turnout. Chair people for various events presented information. In addition, our bylaws were passed and the treasurer's report included acknowledgement that nearly 80 computers were purchased this summer allowing our 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders to have one to one computer availability this school year. We are ending our week tomorrow celebrating Constitution Day which is officially September 17. Mrs. Olson, Mrs. Prasnikar's mom, has led our school the past few years in the celebration. This year she has invited Mayor Axelrod to read a proclamation at our Morning Meeting. Here are some facts we share with students:

Constitution Day Information

The Constitution is an important document in the United States. It establishes the American government and our position as a democracy (a government of the people, by the people and for the people). The Constitution also lays out our freedoms as Americans. Constitution Day is a holiday meant to celebrate and commemorate September 17th, 1787, the day that the United States Constitutional Convention signed the Constitution. It recognizes both the United States Constitution and all those who have become American citizens. Prior to 2004, it was called Citizenship Day. It was changed to Constitution Day after an amendment to the Omnibus Spending Bill was passed in 2004. Today, Constitution Day is mostly celebrated by educating people about the importance of the Constitution and what it has meant for American citizens.

Next week we will host our Curriculum Night on Thursday, September 22. Information about times for both a general meeting and your child's classroom teacher presentation are below. We hope you will attend!

We are most excited to welcome you to another year of Forest Flyers!!! For those families new to the school, Forest Flyers is a program designed to engage kids in running (or walking) and we add in a little bit of fun! Each month, kids will have the option to run 4 days during recess. Running just one lap will earn a child a shoe charm and running 20 laps or more will earn them the special charm of the month. The program is designed so that if children run just 20 laps each month September through April and 50 laps in May (they will have 8 days to run in May) a child will have run their Marathon by May and earn their marathon medal! Kids are welcome to run more than 20 laps a month. Those additional laps will count towards their marathon. 
