On behalf of the seniors I want to wish the team continued success. We respect you all as players and friends, and as we move on you will forever be in our thoughts and memories.





At the beginning of the season we set the goals for our team and tops on the list was to bring home a trophy. We never lost sight of that goal.




What was your first day at WLHS like as a Freshman?
