

THE POWER OF THE LION




The football team got off to a stellar start, but lost the edge needed to make the playoffs due in part to injuries of key players.
















# It's all in how you look at it PHOTOGRAPHY

This musical started of the 1996 -97 drama season with a bang. A joy for all involved, it sold out over three nights in a row.








# Looking up to Leadership




#### TOO TOUGH FOR YOU, JUST RIGHT FOR ME!

With the loss of only three seniors, this team will show their experience next year. The likelihood of the team being district champs again and finishing higher at state looks very good.










With just under 1400 students in the school, I guess its pretty ambitious for a student publication to attempt to get all those faces recorded in the Annual. That is our goal.



Due to the introduction of the trimester schedule for the '96-'97 school year, the school newspaper, *The Amplifier* had to reinvent the way it did business. During the first trimester the staff had to work after school to put the paper together since there was no class. Two papers were issued while the paper was a club. Overall the paper put out eight issues this year.

The paper is put together via a three part process. First story ideas are brain-stormed and assigned to various writers. Secondly, the writers then research and write their stories. Finally page editors (people responsible for laying out a specific page) take the stories, advertisements, photos, and other art and layout their page. This is a challenging, time consuming assignment. Once the pages are layed out on the computer, the editors then manually paste each page together before the newspaper can be sent to the printer. Two days after the paste-ups are delivered, 1400 copies of The Amplifier come back and the month long process begins

To those who work on the paper, it is a hard but rewarding work. The Amplifier staff knew their efforts were worthwile when they heard students say in the hall, "Did you read that story about such and such in the paper?"

"Being a member of The Amplifier has been an enlightening experience," said senior Gabe Carelton-Barnes. "I've learned a lot about both journalism and the way the school operates in general."

Overall the paper continued to improve both in quality of reporting, and layout throughout the year. Although it was a heavily senior staff, next year's staff with their energetic Advisor Mr. Bret Freyer, look to continue to build upon the success of this year's publication.






